CLASS ENTRY FEE ANNOUNCEMENT

Guilsfield Show are happy to announce that for 2023 there are no entry fees to any of the individual classes (horse section excluded). Entry to as many classes as you like is included in the show admission price. We hope this will encourage everyone to get involved and have a go at lots of different classes.

Entries still need to be made as per the conditions stated on the section entry form. On entry to the show when the admission price is paid, everyone will be provided with a wristband. This covers your entry fees for the classes you have entered, and you can also leave/re-enter the show as you please during the day.

General Admission

This ticket includes entry to the show (including the music evening) and all class entries (excluding horse entry). These can either be posted to the relevant section secretary or entries can be left in an envelope at Harding's Garage or the Bottom Shop. Dog In Cars On Hot Days

- When travelling to the show please consider if the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increase time in traffic jams.
- If your car is not air conditioned, seriously consider whether travelling your dog in a car to the show is a good idea.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible. Plenty of stops should be taken en route with lots of drinking water available.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in direct sunlight. There should be plenty of freeflowing air around your dog.
- Never leave your dog in the vehicle when parked.
- Keep your dog in the shade if necessary, take your own shade (eg. A large umbrella) and have plenty of water available for your dog to drink.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
- Remember your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated than you and this could lead to dire results.
- Please look after your dog's welfare at all times.
- If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle maybe necessary.

200g Plain flour 2 small eating apples peeled, cored and chopped

2 tsp baking powder 2 large eggs

½ tsp baking soda
 ½ tsp salt
 1 tsp vanilla extract
 120ml vegetable oil
 150g granulated sugar
 120ml greek yoghurt

Cinnamon ToppingSugar Glaze50g granulated sugar30g icing sugar1 tsp ground cinnamon1- 2 tbsp milk50g butter melted

- 1. Preheat oven to 180 C / 160 C Fan/gas mark 4
- 2. Grease and line a 8 inch round cake tin (guide size only)

- 2. Any exhibitor obtaining a prize fraudulently will forfeit the whole of the prizes awarded.
- 3. Objections to be laid before the Secretary in writing on the day of the show, but in the event of the objection being as to the age or height of an animal, must be raised within one hour of the event on the day. The objector shall deposit £25 with the Secretary and this sum will be forfeited should the objection be considered frivolous.
- 4. Should any objection arise either on the rules or wording of classes, the committee's decision is final.
- No account against the committee shall be recognised unless authorised by the Secretary in writing.
- 6. In all classes the exhibit must have been the bona-fide property of the exhibitor.
- The Committee do not hold themselves responsible for any damage done to exhibits, but all possible care will be taken.
- 8. It is the stewards prerogative to cancel or amalgamate a class if there are insufficient entries.
- 9. Only Official Stewards are allowed in the marquee during judging.
- 10. Entries to be setup in the marquee between 8.30am-10.30am and removed between 5-5.30pm. Guilsfield Show reserve the right to dispose of marquee entries that are not collected.
- 11. All entries to close as per dates in the relevant section in this schedule and on entry forms.
- 12. Winners of cups and trophies are responsible for their safe keeping and insurance.
- 13. Whilst the society will ensure that it takes all reasonable steps to prevent injury to persons or property, neither the Society nor its Officers or servants will accept responsibility for injury to persons or property caused by third parties who act in breach of the terms of this safety policy or are caused by persons or objects outside the control of the Society.


